

Creating Healthy & Just Communities: Anti-Oppression Training Saturday, April 3 / 10:00 am - 6:00 pm / "the yurt"

Cooperative leaders will have the opportunity to build an analysis of power, privilege, and oppression as it operates in their co-ops and communities, take away popular education training tools and techniques, and share ideas for creating inclusive and accessible spaces in co-ops.

Specific plans for proposing changes at the organizational, community, and individual levels for cooperatives and other democratically run communities emerge from a range of group dialogues and creative exercises. Participants will first investigate privilege and oppression in their own lives, then attain analysis skills for identifying and dismantling oppression in communities, and finally strategize how to take this work home to their specific co-ops, collectives, and communities.

In the day-long training, participants will:

- learn anti-oppression core concepts and language,
- play a variety of popular education games for team building and understanding anti-oppression concepts,
- utilize popular education tools for illuminating how oppression manifests in specific co-op communities,
- strategize action steps to transform their co-op,
- explore specific topics based in the group's interests (examples: trans issues, classism, cultural appropriation, environmental racism)
- engage in dialogue around allyship and accountability

At the end of the day, participants will receive anti-oppression resources. There will be opportunities during WestCo to continue discussions from the training.

All levels of knowledge around anti-oppression are welcome!

Note: the curriculum is developed with the idea that participants are present during the entire training (rather than attending a portion).
